All About Words is a practical guide designed to help early childhood teachers take advantage of the unique opportunity provided by the Common Core State Standards. It offers strategies for planning and presenting vocabulary instruction and for monitoring children's word learning progress, along with helpful appendices that provide specific guidance on which words to teach.

The text supports Ohio's Plan to Raise Literacy Achievement and is designed to support the planning and implementation of meaningful vocabulary instruction in Early Childhood settings. Participants shall read the book, complete the application exercises, and engage in three live virtual discussion sessions to receive 10 contact hours.

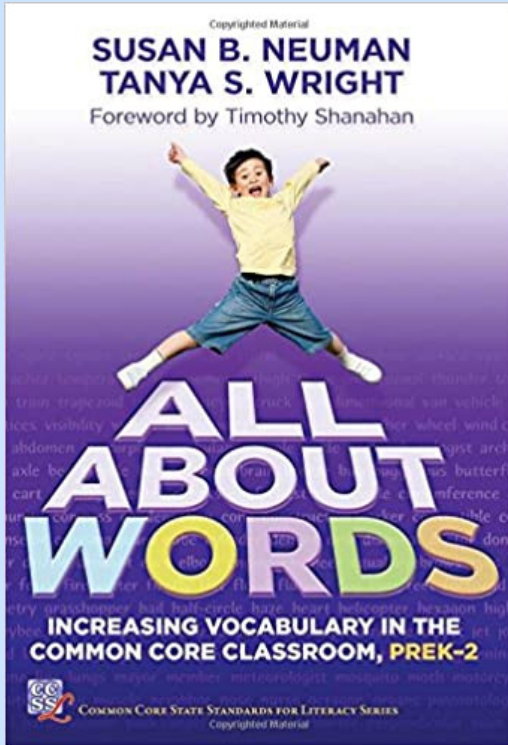
