Dynamic Vocabulary Instruction

Dr. Anita Archer will provide a virtual training for teachers focused on Dynamic Vocabulary Instruction for children during their elementary and adolescent years. Elementary sessions will focus on vocabulary everywhere, explicit vocabulary instruction, and word learning strategies. Adolescent sessions will focus on providing rich language experiences, explicit instruction on domain specific vocabulary, and word learning strategies.
