Are you prepared to meet the needs of **ALL students for the 2022-2023 school** year? The federal law has been consistent for 50 years since Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, but our student's individual needs are continuously evolving. Across the State, there is an increase in student medical absences, mental health diagnoses, and situational trauma. Student behaviors range from difficulty completing grade-level work to truancy and aggressive outward behaviors. Where is the line between 504 plans and IDEA? Be prepared to meet your students for a successful start to the school year by attending an in-depth review of Section 504 identification, procedures, and processes by the Civil **Rights Council for Ennis Britton.**
